Thursday, May 22, 2025 – Glover Town Hall




1. The meeting was called to order at 6:32pm.
2. **Additions or deletions to the agenda:** none
3. **Minutes: Anne made motion, seconded by Glenn, to approve the minutes dated May 8, 2025. The motion carried.**
4. **Road Update:**
 - a. The road crew have been grading and working on culverts. They have applied two tanks of chloride to roads they have graded. Truck #22 is still in the shop. This makes 13-14 weeks the vehicle has not been used by the town. Mike is seeking paving bids for Davio Place and School Street. He has received one quote and is waiting for a response from several other paving companies.
 - b. **Rodger's Road Update:** The Board received a petition from many residents on Rodgers Road, indicating they do not support closing any section of the Rodgers Road. Several residents also attended to voice their objection to closing the road. They indicated their concern for land value for "land locked" property, and being able to access their property if the road becomes flooded or blocked by fallen trees again. The Selectboard has stated they believe it is not in the best interest of the town to discontinue any existing town roads due to the cost to re-establish the road if needed in the future and this is setting a precedence for other Glover roads that are in similar circumstances (ie: Young Road, Hinman Road, Clark Road, etc). At the meeting held on May 8, 2025, John had indicated his concern about the amount of traffic that travels the road, the road is in close proximity to his home and people trespass onto his property. It was suggested signs be posted, on both ends of the road, indicating it is not a through road. In an effort to move forward and maintain the road to town standards, **Glenn made a motion, seconded by Phil, to keep Rodgers Road, a.k.a. Town Highway 48 as Class 3 road to Class 4 road and back to Class 3 road. The motion carried.**
 - c. Letter of Intent for FY26 GIA: The Board reviewed the Letter of Intent for the Municipal Roads Grant In Aid. The letter was signed.
5. **Town Administrator Report:**
 - a. Shadow Lake Dam Update: Weston & Sampson provided the Selectboard with several scenarios that could address repairing the Shadow Lake Dam. Many residents from around the lake attended this meeting seeking more information and expressing their concern about the proposed scenarios. It was brought up that the former engineers, Dubois & King, had provided scenarios not presented by Weston & Sampson. It was mentioned that Weston & Sampson created their scenarios based on a 1000 year flood condition standards and there are requirements imposed by the Vermont Dam Safety

- Engineers that must be followed. Weston & Sampson are scheduled to attend the June 26, 2025 meeting to address questions and concerns from both the Selectboard and the Shadow Lake Association members. The Board will postpone making a decision until after the June 26th meeting. Shadow Lake Association members expressed their appreciation for all the work Theresa is doing related to the Shadow Lake Dam.
- b. **Municipal Building:** Theresa spoke with Bonnie Ingalls about which method she recommended to clean a building to prepare it for painting. Bonnie recommended scraping. You have to wait for the building to dry thoroughly before applying any paint, also, pressure washing could allow water to seep into the building.
 - c. **Local Emergency Management Plan (LEMP):** The LEMP was reviewed and signed.
6. **Orleans County Sheriff's Report – April:** The Board reviewed the report. No action needed.
7. **Treasurer's Report:**
- a. **Barton Area Senior Services, Inc (BASSI) 2025 Contract:** The Board received a proposed 2025 contract with BASSI. They agreed with the proposed changes. The agreement will be signed at the next meeting.
 - b. **Resignation of Auditor:** Jonathan Gilbert has resigned from being an elected Auditor. Jeremy Young has expressed an interest in replacing Jonathan. Cindy and the Auditors will speak with Mr Young further.
 - c. **Peter Franzoni Proposed Resolution Letter:** The Board will review the proposed "Resolution Condemning Attacks on Due Process and Affirming the Constitutional Rights of all People in Glover" at the next meeting.
8. **Open public comment period:**
- a. **Amos Turner – VT Electric:** Amos spoke with VT Electric Co-op about bringing electricity to Glover Park. The cost estimate will be available soon. What type of amp is needed? 100 amp or 200 amp. An easement from Greg Bodette will be required. The Board suggested 200 amp service. The Board expressed their appreciation to Amos for doing this research.
9. **Signing of Director's Orders:** The orders were signed.
10. **Adjourn:** Glenn made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:29pm.
