Please read the following road ordinance:

Town of Glover ROAD ORDINANCE

Notwithstanding circumstances created by changing weather conditions, the Town of Glover will endeavor to keep town roads in a reasonable and safe condition for travelers. Travelers who use town roads and designated walkways are expected to demonstrate due care and reasonable caution, especially under adverse winter conditions. Travelers are cautioned not to follow snowplows and other maintenance equipment too closely and to pass town equipment operating on town highways only after the operator has given the okay to pass. The Town of Glover will undertake to remove accumulated snow and ice from traveled roads by regular plowing and sanding. At a minimum, during any winter storm, the road crew will endeavor to clear roads twice daily, before the morning travel period and the use of roads by school buses, and in the late afternoon, before the school bus run. Additional plowing, snowbank leveling, and sanding or application of salt will be done at the discretion of the Road Foreman. Any resident or traveler in the town, who becomes aware of a road hazard or impassable road may contact the Selectboard. They will inform the Road Foreman about the condition, and it shall be his/her responsibility to mitigate the hazard at the earliest possible time, commensurate with road conditions and availability of equipment and manpower.

You may ask yourself...

Can I plow snow into or across the Town Right-of-Way (ROW)?

No! The plowing, shoveling, or blowing of snow into or across any Town road is prohibited by State Law. Doing so creates unsafe travel conditions. Even small amounts of snow, freezing in the roadway, can cause loss of control or damage to a vehicle.

Can I park in the road or on the side of the Town Right-of-Way During a snowstorm.

NO! If it is snowing, please do not park your vehicle in the road or on the side of the road. If your car/truck is broken down leave a note on the windshield saying so and call the town office to warn the drivers. That vehicle needs to be at least one vehicle length off the curb of the road. The road crew will leave a warning on your vehicle if it is determined that it is obstructing traffic or endangers others. Use common sense driving on winter roads.
