

# Do you have COLD, DRAFTY windows in the winter?

Consider window inserts. Window inserts are insulating interior storm windows constructed of custom-made pine frames wrapped in two layers of tightly sealed, clear plastic film and finished with a compressible foam gasket. These are more cost effective than window replacements - and you help to assemble them in a community workshop. Some households may qualify for free or reduced cost inserts and Efficiency Vermont is offering a rebate. One 3' x 4' window insert saves on average 9 gallons of heating fuel each winter. That can really add up!
